

VOCABULARY Education



Outlook 1 presents a carefully selected vocabulary syllabus aligned to B1 – B1+.

The vocabulary is presented in context, as well as practised in exercises.

In this unit, the topic vocabulary is related to education.

Outlook 1 Interactive Student (IS) offers helpful online material that your students can use to prepare before the lesson. This advance preparation will encourage more productive classroom participation, since students will come to class able to use the subject material more effectively. This material includes a wordlist with translations as well as audio of the vocabulary that they are going to learn in this section.

Outlook 1 Interactive Classroom (IC) offers an interactive classroom presentation for each vocabulary lesson. You may also want to use this wordlist with translations before starting this vocabulary lesson to check your students' familiarity with the vocabulary items that they are going to study.

Remind students that there is a full **glossary at the back of the Student's Book on pages 135-147.**

- 1** Tell students to read the students' comments about their first day of school. Remind them to pay attention to the words in colour.

Then, ask them which of the students in Exercise 1 say each one of the ideas listed. Check students' understanding of *besides* (sentence 4).
